Eddy Brown Memorial Metal Match (EBMMM) Info:

This match is held in memory and to keep honoring Eddy Brown's contribution to our shooting sports by bringing the Steel Challenge to the Northwest and who ran the Canadian Steel Challenge in Cranbrook, BC Canada. Eddy passed away Dec 27th, 2000 at age 37 from a massive heart attack. In honor of Eddy, all steel is painted his favorite color, pink.

EBMMM RULES:

Any 9mm center fire gun or larger, there is no declared power factor. Sunday man on man will be set so poppers should fall with 125 power factor ammo. Go to www.steelchallenge.org for all the current rules and stages

SAFETY:

All firearms can only be handled in safety areas with NO AMMO handling or at the shooting line in the presence of a range officer.

START POSITION:

Gun loaded and holstered, wrists above shoulders. Creeping before the beep and misses will add 3 seconds to that string.

RANGE COMMANDS:

You should come to the line prepared to shoot a minimum of 25 rounds. The RO will ask if "you understand the course of fire", if you state "yes" he will proceed then with "LOAD AND MAKE READY" only then may you load your gun. This command will be followed with "is the shooter ready" a short delay and then "STAND BY". Any movement after "stand by" and before the beep will constitute a premature start and you will be awarded a 3 second penalty per infraction.

SCORING:

Each target must show 5 hits when finished or a 3 second penalty is added PER MISS. Steel is painted between each shooter. The stop plate MUST BE engaged last. If you hit the designated stop plate TIME STOPS and 5 seconds will be added to your overall time per miss. No string can EXCEED 30 seconds. No arbitration is allowed, ROs are kind and generous but their decision is final. You shoot each stage 5 consecutive times and throw out your worst run and add up the 4 fastest runs.

Plaques are awarded Saturday immediately following the match. Plaques are for 1st, 2nd, & 3rd Overall, 1st, 2nd, & 3rd of their classes as well as divisions ie: Open, Limited, Revolver, Senior, Junior, Lady.
